





#### Modes of participation

## No participation or unethical participation

In most societies, the majority of adolescents have little or no opportunity to express their views

#### Consultative participation

- ✓ adult initiated:
- √adult led and managed;
- ✓ lacking possibility for adolescents to control outcomes:
- ✓ recognizing the added value that adolescents' perspective. knowledge and experience can contribute.

#### Collaborative Participation

- ✓ adult initiated:
- ✓ involving partnership with adolescents:
- ✓ enabling adolescents to influence or challenge both process and outcome:
- ✓ allowing for increasing levels of self-directed action by adolescents over a period of time.


#### Adolescent-led Participation

- ✓ the issues of concern being identified by adolescents themselves:
- ✓ adults serving as facilitators rather than leaders;
- ✓ adolescents
  controlling the
  process and the
  outcomes.



#### Language


- MTL

## Output of the 1st PAR project 2012-2015

- Restoration of lost community ties
- Better well-being for elderly and younger people
- Youth leaders
- Younger people speak their language with confidence and pride.
- Still, they cannot read and write.

# PAR project on language revitalization

A revitalization project that fosters relationships among community members, relevant stakeholders, and linguists

It can be seen as a re-creation of speaker community providing spaces and times for the language to 'live'
