<b>Starting Level</b>	CEFR B1
<b>Time</b>	Wednesdays 16:00-17:30, 8.9.-15.12.2021
<b>Venue</b>	Remote teaching via Zoom and Moodle
<b>Target group</b>	Students on CEFR levels B1. Students of all programmes and faculties, students in the flexible study rights scheme (JOO), international students, non-university learners. Partially fulfils the foreign language requirement in the degree.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	Starting level approximately CEFR B1(higher).Have finished HSK5 learning, completed Advanced Chinese 4 course as example; or have completed 3 years Chinese learning at least. If you are uncertain about your level, contact the teacher before sign up.
<b>Learning outcomes</b>	After completing the course, students are expected to be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>♦ write sentences using medium structures of Chinese;</li> <li>♦ compose short essay;</li> <li>♦ prepare practical-oriented writing</li> </ul>
<b>Course completion methods</b>	This is a course with 28 contact learning hours and 28 hours guided work. At least 75% active participation and completion of the agreed tasks by the deadline is required.  Exam (written essay) 40%; Class attendance & participation 30%; Home Assignment 30%.
<b>Course content</b>	This course will cover the main types of practical writing, such as letter/invitation/envelop, poster, notice, (informal) notes, short CV, small essay and PPT presentations on specific topic.
<b>Study materials</b>	Materials prepared by the teacher
<b>Activities and teaching methods in support of learning</b>	Writing exercises, essay-writing, home assignments and small research projects.
<b>Assessment practices and criteria, grading scale</b>	Assessment is based on the aspects mentioned under the course learning outcomes and consists of assignments, participation and performance in classroom activities, presentation and the final exam.  The course is graded as pass/fail.
