

KK-KII002 Elementary Chinese 2 (3cr)

Starting level	CEFR 0, Beginner
Time	Tue and Thu 18:15-19:45, 1 November- 16 December 2021
Venue	Remote teaching via Zoom
Target group	Students on CEFR levels 0. Mainly non-university learners, but students of all programmes and faculties, students in the flexible study rights scheme (JOO), international students may also take this course.
Timing	After completing KK-KII001 Elementary Chinese 1 (2cr).
Prerequisites	KK-KII001 Elementary Chinese 1 (2cr) or equivalent studies of 28 hours. If you are uncertain about your CEFR level , contact the teacher before signing up.
Learning outcomes	After completing the course, students are expected to be able to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. understand very slow, clear speech and simple texts, 2. learn about 240 Chinese words, 3. communicate with people using basic vocabulary and structures, on topics like travel, ordering food and drinks, buying things, commenting etc. , 4. use structures featuring grammars and structures mentioned below. 5. learn around 200 Chinese characters and their structures.
Course completion methods	This is a contact learning course with 28 hours of contact teaching and 53 hours of independent work. To complete the course at least 75% active participation in the course and completion of the agreed tasks by deadline is required.
Course content	Listening: short, slow statements and dialogues Topics: describing locations, daily schedule, ordering, buying gifts, and doing sports, traffic. Grammar: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • adverb “jiu, hai, zhen, zui, yijing, zai” • reduplication of verbs • particle “le” indicating occurrence or completion • comparative sentence using “bi” • complements of result • complement of state degree • emphasis structure “shi...de”
Study materials	《HSK Standard Course 2》 Author: Jiang Liping, 2014, 2nd edition, ISBN 978-7-5619-3726-6. The books (textbook + workbook) can be bought at the Confucius Institute at the beginning of the course (31e). There are some copies also in the university library.
Assessment practices and	Assessment is based on the aspects mentioned under the course learning outcomes and consists of assignments, participation and

criteria, grading scale	performance in classroom activities, presentation and the final exam. The course is graded as pass/fail.
