Purpose of the workshop:

To explore different ways that public sector organizations in the Nordic countries are approaching- and practicing work on public sector innovation. Innovation is a key topic for the Nordic countries today (*Nordic Innovation Annual Report 2017*). Most recently, Denmark has published a new “Innovation barometer” that tracks public sector innovations systematically through the Danish National Center for Public Sector Innovation: <http://coi.dk/en/what-we-do/innovationbarometer/> Norway and Sweden are interested in establishing innovation barometres of their own. This move reflects a larger trend where innovation in the public sector is becoming an emerging part of public sector reform and change. The OECD is also focused on public sector innovation through its “OECD Observatory of public sector innovation” <https://www.oecd-opsi.org/>. Meanwhile, the academic interest in public sector innovation is flourishing (see, for example, *Innovation in the Public Sector. 2nd edition* by Bekkes, Edelen os & Steijn, PalgraveMacMillan 2014). The workshop will be exploring how public sector innovation occurs in the Nordic public sectors, and how public sector innovation can help create public value for citizens in the way Mark Moore (*Recognizing Public Value*, Harvard University Press, 2013) has described it.

The workshop is by invitation only.

The workshop is funded by the ReNew-initiative and the sub-theme of “Democracy, Law and Governance”

The workshop is intended to be the beginning of a series of workshops.

The workshop is organized on a principle of “bring your latest paper”. You can either present your recent paper in this field or give a powerpoint presentation about a new project that you are doing.
